I. Non-Discrimination PolicyStatement

It is the policy of the Senior Resource Center Transportation Division that no person shall on the grounds of race, color, and national origin be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in any operation of Senior Resource Center Transportation Division as provided by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related statutes.

This policy applies to an operations of the Senior Resource Center Transportation Division, including its contractors and anyone who acts on behalf of the Senior Resource Center Transportation Division. This policy also applies to the operations of any department or agency to which the Senior Resource Center Transportation Division extends federal financial assistance. Federal financial assistance includes grants, training, use of equipment, donations of surplus property, and other assistance.

Prohibited discrimination may be intentional or unintentional. Seemingly neutral acts that have disparate impacts on individuals of a protected group and lack a substantial legitimate justification are a form of prohibited discrimination. Harassment and retaliation are also prohibited forms of discrimination.

Examples of prohibited types of discrimination based on race, color, and national origin include: Denial to an individual any service, financial aid, or other benefit; Distinctions in the quality, quantity, or manner in which a benefit is provided; Segregation or separate treatment; Restriction in the enjoyment of any advantages, privileges, or other benefits provided; Discrimination in any activities related to highway and infrastructure or facility built or repaired; and Discrimination in employment.

Title VI compliance is a condition of receipt of federal funds. The Title VI Coordinator is authorized to ensure compliance with this policy, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C § 2000d and related statutes, and the requirements of 23 Code of Federal Regulation (CFR) pt. 200 and 49 CFR pt. 21.

II. Organization, Staffing, and Structure

The Executive Director of Transportation is ultimately responsible for assuring full compliance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related statutes and has directed that non-discrimination is required of all agency employees, contractors, and agents pursuant to 23 CFR Part 200 and 49 CFR Part 21.

The Senior Resource Center Transportation Division has created the position of Title VI Officer to perform the duties of the Title VI Coordinator and ensure implementation of agency's Title VI program. The position of Title VI Officer is located within the Transportation Division of the Senior Resource Center.

The Title VI Officer is responsible for:

- Submitting a Title VI plan to the City of Freeport on the agency's behalf;
- Developing procedures for the prompt processing and disposition of complaints;
- Investigating complaints, compiling a complaint log, and reporting to the City of Freeport.
- Developing procedures for the collection and analysis of statistical data.
- Developing a program to conduct Title VI reviews of program areas;
- Developing Title VI information for dissemination;
- Establishing procedures for resolving deficiency status and reducing to writing the remedial action agreed to be necessary.

IV. Title VI ComplaintProcedures

Complaints may be filed by accessing the Pretzel City Area Transit website www.pretzelcitytransit.com and going to the Forms Section, and clicking on the Senior Resource Center - Pretzel City Area Transit Compliance Plan - Freeport OR completing a Complaint Form and submitting to the Senior Resource Center Executive Director of Transportation.

Discrimination Complaint Procedure *for* the Senior Resource Center Transportation Division

Federal law prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, and national origin in any Senior Resource Center Transportation Division program or activity. This prohibition applies to all branches of the Senior Resource Center Transportation Division, its contractors, consultants, and anyone else who acts on behalf of the Senior Resource Center Transportation Division.

Federal law requires that the Senior Resource Center Transportation Division investigate, track, and report discrimination complaints. Complaints must be filed in writing and will be investigated within sixty days of submission. If you need assistance to file your complaint or need interpretation services, please contact the Senior Resource Center Executive Director of Transportation.

Who is eligible to file a complaint?

Anyone who believes they have been excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under any Senior Resource Center Transportation Division program or activity because of their race, color, national origin may file a complaint.

Discrimination includes lack of access, harassment, retaliation and disparate impacts from a program or activity. Harassment includes a wide range of abusive and humiliating verbal or physical behaviors. Retaliation includes intimidating, threatening, coercing, or engaging in other discriminatory conduct against anyone because they filed a complaint or otherwise participated a discrimination investigation.

How do you file a complaint?

Complaints must be filed in writing within 180 days from the last date of the alleged discrimination. However, contact the Senior Resource Center Executive Director of Transportation if you believe your complaint may fall outside this deadline.

Reasonable efforts will be made to assist persons with disabilities, non-English speakers, and others unable to file a written complaint. For assistance in filing a complaint, please contact the Senior Resource Center Executive Director of Transportation.

What happens after a complaint is filed?

Title VI complaints must be investigated within sixty days. Investigating a complaint includes interviewing all parties involved and key witnesses. The investigator may also request relevant information such as books, records, electronic information, and other sources of information from all involved parties. You may specify if there is a particular individual or individuals that you feel should not investigate your complaint due to conflict of interest or other reasons.

In some cases, complaints will be forwarded to either the City of Freeport, the Illinois Department of Transportation, or the Federal Transit Administration for investigation. If your complaint is forwarded to one of these agencies, you will be provided the name and contact information of the employee handling your complaint.

Federal law prohibits retaliation against individuals because they have filed a discrimination complaint or otherwise participated in a discrimination investigation. Any alleged retaliation should be reported in writing to the investigator.
